





- **Sewage Treatment Plant:** The campus has an eco-friendly STP (Sewage Treatment Plant) comprising of multigrade filters, activated carbon filters and softener to re-cycle the treated water for flushing and horticulture.
- Outer Walls: The outer walls have AAC Block (Air Aerated Concrete Blocks) which is energy efficient and environment friendly.
- **Inner Walls:** The inner partitions of the school building are made up of dry wall partitions, thereby, saving energy and restricting utilization of water during construction.
- Building-Integrated Photovoltaic (BIPV) panel: The central green play area is proposed to have a transparent solar Building-integrated photovoltaic (BIPV) panel covering, for trapping solar energy for the electrical requirements of the building.
- Rainwater Charging System: A Rainwater Charging System operational in the school collects and drains rain water through perforated pipes to recharge water levels and prevent depletion of the underground water table.
- Students' visit to school's rainwater and sewage treatment plant to educate them about various methods deployed to conserve, recycle and reuse waste water.
- RO Water Purifiers: The school has Reverse Osmosis Water Purifying System to provide safe portable water to the children
- **LED Lights:** The school uses energy efficient and eco-friendly LED lights which emits more light and consumes less energy.
- Inter Solar Panels: The school has the energy efficient Inter solar panels to heat the swimming pool according to the seasonal needs of the children.
- Anti-Pollutant DC Generator: For 24x 7 power back up, the school has installed a smoke and noise-free, anti-pollutant DC Generator to keep the surroundings and environment at large pollution free.
- Air Filters: The school has used environment friendly design techniques of which Air Filters has a significant role to play. It removes the solid particulate matter and the charcoal present in it as an absorbent removes odours. This eradicates the use of Air Purifiers & maintains the circulation of the high -quality air within the premises.
- **Eco-friendly Vegetation:** The go green designing of the school is supported by the green trees planted within the campus, 'Benjamin Ficus' which produce double the oxygen keeping the campus and the inmates free from any health hazard.
- **Open Green Area:** The open and green play area is neatly carpeted with synthetic grass making the campus dust-free and eco-friendly. It is also resistant to minor injuries thus, leading to enhanced productivity and health benefits to children.
- Water Storage Capacity: The school has an amazing life-size water storage tank capacity in the basement that amass unbelievingly 70,000 gallons of water for its various purposes. The inner lining of the water tank is water resistant with a width of 500 cm to keep the structure safe from corrosion or leakage of any sort.

The school provides effective surveillance and security systems that act as deterrent factors.

High boundary walls and firefighting system with fire alarm panel also makes the campus safe & secure.
